KOZHIKODE: Health minister V S Sivakumar said the state government will soon launch the union government-sponsored National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) scheme across the state.

He added that the state had spent Rs 2.75 crore for the development of Kottaparamba hospital so far. An expert team of the National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers (NABH) will visit the hospital next week to conduct a performance audit. The team will inspect the infrastructure facilities set up at the hospital.

Sivakumar said the state government has already appointed twenty staff-members at the hospital.

Minister for social justice M K Muneer, who presided over the function, said a sum of Rs 7 lakh will be sanctioned from the MLA fund to the hospital to purchase an ambulance. Steps will be also taken to appoint an officer at the blood bank attached to the hospital, he said.
